"We were united; that was our strength, and we soon started to understand and address the critical problems of the community. Sr. Maria Regina remained in St. Mary's, organizing the adoption project; Sr. Francisca was taking care of abandoned children because, when moms died, babies were denied care by the rest of the family, abandoned, and died. Sr. Ettorina was doing a little bit of everything... she was with the youth and driving priests everywhere to say mass for the people because most were so old and could not drive. They used to stay all day in the communities..."
